The 5th International Conference of Aquapolises (ICAP) to be held in Busan Metropolitan City, Korea from May 21 – 23 with participation of 45 aquapolises from 15 countries

■ Overview of the 5th International Conference of Aquapolises

The 5th International Conference of Aquapolises (hereinafter referred to as “ICAP”) will be held at Nurimaru APEC House and BEXCO (Busan Exhibition & Convention Center) in Busan Metropolitan City from May 21–23, 2008. The objective of the 5th ICAP is to discuss the ideal future of aquapolises in the 21st century under the main theme, “For a Sustainable Aquapolis,” exchanging information, including know-how for urban development featuring water and greenery, and with participation of mayors, experts and other delegates from 45 aquapolises in 15 countries around the world.

At a plenary session, under the theme, “For a Sustainable Aquapolis,” participating mayors and governors will discuss and exchange opinions on each city's initiatives related to water and greenery, and compile the results into the Busan Declaration. At experts' sessions, under each session's sub-theme, experts will present their city's initiatives and exchange opinions.



■ Overview of ICAP

ICAP is an international conference of delegates from world cities called aquapolises, each with their own unique features related to water and greenery. The objective of ICAP is to promote development of the following cities through discussion:

- (1) nature and humankind coexist in harmony
- (2) water and greenery are preserved and used to create a comfortable environment
- (3) waterside and verdant spaces are restored or created to foster scenic beauty

Experts from world cities will exchange information on each other's know-how for urban development featuring water and greenery and other related matters. They will also discuss the future direction and challenges for aquapolises, and communicate the attractiveness of aquapolises to the world. ICAP will continue to be held in the hope that various inter-city exchanges at the citizen, expert and government levels will take place to promote redevelopment of existing aquapolises into more attractive ones that will lead the civilization of the 21st century.
