A Long-Term Care Insurance Card is issued to Category 1 and Category 2 Insured Individuals who apply for certification. You will need it when receiving long-term care services, so make sure to keep your card in a safe place at all times.

- apply for certification for long-term care needs (new applications, certification renewal, change in care level);
- request a care service plan;
- receive long-term care services.
