Costs borne by the care recipient may be deducted as medical expenses when filing tax returns.

(Note) Those who require Care Level 1 or 2 and are applicable to exceptional requirements will be eligible for enrollment.

### What Are Community-Based Services?

These services are to enable the elderly to stay living in their current homes for as long as possible by offering them flexible services from local service providers in their communities when daily activities become difficult and they need care or assistance.

As a rule, individuals insured by the Osaka City Government can only receive community-based services provided by service providers within Osaka City.
