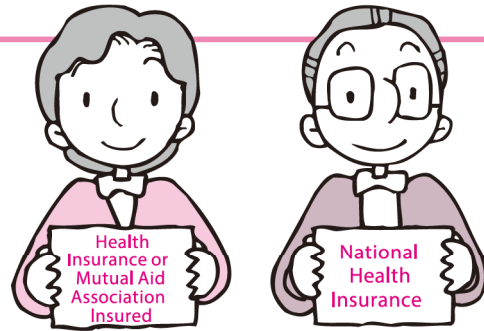


## Insurance Premiums for Ages 40 to 64 (Category 2 Insured)

### ● Payment method

For those between the ages of 40 and 64 covered by medical insurance, Long-Term Care Insurance premiums are charged along with the medical insurance premium.

### ● Premium



#### Health Insurance or Mutual Aid Association Insured

- Insurance premium varies according to salary.
- Half of the insurance premium is paid by the employer.
- For dependents such as employees' spouses, additional insurance premiums are not required.

#### National Health Insurance

- Insurance fee varies according to income and the number of people insured.
- An equal amount of insurance premiums are covered by public funds.
- The head of the household pays insurance premiums for all other household members (Category 2 Insured).

Under the City of Osaka's National Health Insurance System, when a Category 2 Insured individual becomes a Category 1 Insured, the insurance premiums up to the day before becoming Category 1 Insured will be paid over ten months from June to March of the next year.

## Overdue Payments (Category 1 Insured)

For regular collection, if payments are delayed beyond the deadline stated on the payment slip, you will be unable to use the slip at a financial institution. You will need to contact the Long-Term Care Insurance Service Counter of your local ward

### Reminder

If you have failed to pay your premiums, a reminder with a payment slip will be sent every month.

### Letter of Demand

If you fail to respond to the reminders, a letter of demand together with a payment slip will be sent every three months.

### Collection

Collection staff will visit your house to collect overdue payments.



#### Notes

- If you are late in payments, late charges will apply.
- If you are repeatedly late in payments despite having adequate financial resources, your assets may be seized.
- If two years have passed from the deadline, payment can no longer be accepted and benefits may be restricted.

To prevent late payments, use bank transfers to make your payments.
