The 5th International Conference of Aquapolises (ICAP) Busan Metropolitan City, South Korea from May 21 to 23, 2008

Busan City will be hosting the 5th International Conference of Aquapolises (ICAP) from May 21 to 23, 2008 at Nurimaru APEC House and BEXCO. Theme will be "For a Sustainable Aquapolis." About 100 participants, including mayors, experts, from around 30 aquapolis cities throughout the world are expected to attend the Conference. ICAP in Busan will offer an opportunity to build a green image and enhance the status of Busan as a global city.

ICAP is an international conference of delegates from world cities, each with their own unique culture and history formed by the harmonious coexistence of water and greenery. ICAP held its first conference in Osaka, Japan in 1990, with participation from 33 cities in 23 countries; the second conference was held in Shanghai, China, with delegates from 28 cities in 22 countries; the third was in Piraeus, Greece, attended by 22 cities in 11 countries, and the fourth in Osaka, Japan again, with participation from 55 cities in 22 countries.

The objective of ICAP is to create (1) cities of harmonious coexistence between nature and humans, (2) comfortable cities rich in water and greenery, and (3) beautiful cities created by redeveloping waterfront and greenery spaces.

Major events, by daily schedule, are as follows: Day 1 (May 21 at Nurimaru APEC House): Opening Ceremony, Keynote Speech and Welcome Reception

Day 2 (May 22 at BEXCO): Experts' Sessions, Briefing Session on Investment Attractions to Busan City, Adoption of Joint Declaration Statement and Closing Ceremony

Day 3 (May 23): Farewell Ceremony

 An exhibition on water and the environment will be held in conjunction with the conference.




