

The development of Osaka is based on a long history of interaction between rivers, industry, people, and daily life. Osaka's rivers, which cover approximately one-tenth of the city area, distinguish it from other cities, and are an important resource that can help greatly in the city's development.

to reinvigorate Osaka's urban areas by using this resource to create new scenery, a new sense of activity, and new environments, to construct a "water corridor" from the Dotombori, Higashi-Yokobori, Dojima, Tosabori, and Kizu Rivers, which surround the city center in a way that is quite rare among international cities, and to re-create a water-based urban charm.
