[Examples of Use]

Point at  (Want) and , ask "Do you have anything that you want?", and then show the following list of pictograms. Point at the pictogram of an item that might be needed and ask "Do you want (the name of the item)?" If there is no reply, point at  (No appropriate symbols) and  and ask "Is what you want not on this list?"

When you hand out something, point at  (Hand out) and the pictogram of the item to be handed out and say "(the name of the item) will be handed out"

Emergency communication board



This communication board is designed to support people who have difficulty in communicating in the event of a disaster.

Mentally challenged, autistic, and aphasic people as well as foreigners or other people who cannot understand or clearly pronounce words can use the board to communicate by pointing at pictograms on it. Place the board between people providing and receiving support.

The supporters can point at pictograms expressing what they wish to communicate when they talk. If the people receiving the support point at pictograms, the supporters shall try to surmise their message and check it by expressing it verbally, like "Do you mean (the item indicated by the pictogram)?"
