### Bosai Information Mail

Circulates the city's disaster measures information and information needed in times of disaster to your registered mobile phone or PC e-mail address

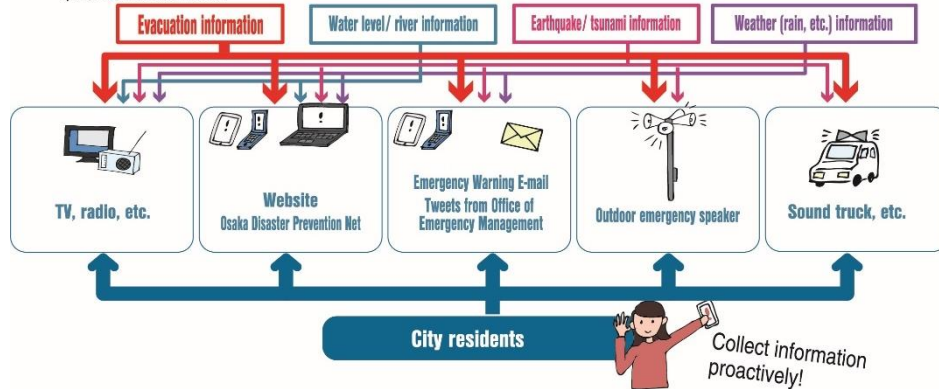

## Diversification of information sources

- As the sound from outdoor emergency speakers may not reach inside homes and buildings, Emergency Warning E-mails and Area Mails are sent to mobile phones and smartphones to inform about evacuation and other matters.
- In times of disaster, the ward's sound trucks make rounds to broadcast information.
- In addition, evacuation and other information is circulated by the City of Osaka Emergency App, Osaka City's official Line account, Osaka City Office of Emergency Management's Twitter account, and Osaka Disaster Prevention Net's Bosai Information Mail. Information is also provided to TV and radio broadcasters.

### Information for people who do not own mobile phones

- If outdoor emergency speaker broadcasts could not be heard: call the Government Disaster Wireless Telephone Service (06-6210-3899), charges apply.
- In times of disaster, switch your TV to NHK and press the "d" button for data broadcasting to view evacuation advisories, if evacuation shelters are open, and other information.
