
Chapter 6

In case of emergency



Report the Fire

- Yell "Fire!" to alert the people around you. Don't act alone; ask as many people as possible for help.
- Calm yourself and call 119 from a safe place.

What to do when you call 119 to report a fire

- When you report a fire, calmly describe the situation in as much detail as possible including information about anyone who is sick or injured.
- If you need to call while you are driving, be sure to first stop at a safe spot and then make the call.
- If you don't know the address of the place that is on fire, look around for a large building, public facility, name of an intersection or convenience store, or an address written on a vending machine sticker.
- If you are calling from a mobile phone, do not turn it off because the fire department may need to contact you again.

Reporting Procedures

1) Calm yourself and call 119

"I need to report a fire." or "There's a medical emergency."

3 Describe the situation

Reporting by Fax or E-mail

You can fax or e-mail to report a fire when it is difficult to get through to 119 from a phone within Osaka City.



Information needed for writing a fax or e-mail

- O State whether you are reporting a fire or a medical emergency
- O Location (address) of the site
- Description of the current situation such as what is on fire or the condition of the injured or sick person
- O Your name
- * When you need an ambulance, if possible, please give the patient's age and sex.
- * The emergency service will reply as soon as they receive your fax or e-mail. If there is no reply, please recheck the fax number or e-mail address and send it again.

Put Out the Fire

It is important to put out the fire quickly to minimize the amount of damage . Keep a fire extinguisher or bucket somewhere convenient in case of an emergency.

How to use a fire extinguisher

- Get close to the origin of the fire with the fire extinguisher
- Pull out the safety pin
- Aim the hose/ nozzle at the base of the fire (check what is burning)
- Forcefully squeeze the lever (Injection)
- * Don't use any fire extinguisher with rust, scratches, dents, etc.

How to put out a grease fire

- Do NOT try to extinguish a grease fire with water.
- Take the lid that fits the pot and push it over the pot from the front and cover the flame.
- Extinguish the flames by covering them with a large towel or other material that you've moistened with water and wrung out.
- Turn off the heat source (gas valve) immediately after you put out the fire.
- Put the fire out with a fire extinguisher.

Evacuate

- Yell "Fire!" as you escape to alert the people around you.
- If you have to escape through smoke, cover your mouth and nose with a handkerchief, crouch down, and get under the smoke as you escape.
- Always be sure that you know of at least two exits that you can take to evacuate.
- Do not use elevators.
- Once you are outside, close the door, and do not go back in.

^{*}Exercise care concerning flying droplets of oil when extinguishing the fire.
