The regularly scheduled Nemophila Festival will be cancelled in 2025 to coincide with Expo 2025 Osaka, Kansai.

Adults and children over 8 years old and at least 125 cm tall can ride the go-karts! Enjoy the feeling of being an F1 racer to the fullest!



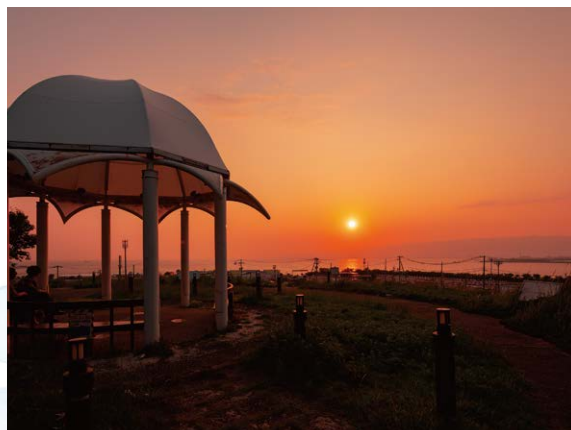
