Further strengthen its function as a global tourism hub in line with the urban development of Phase 1 by promoting city development based on the large-scale entertainment and recreation functions, Expo philosophy, cutting-edge initiatives, and the vibrancy created in Phase 1.

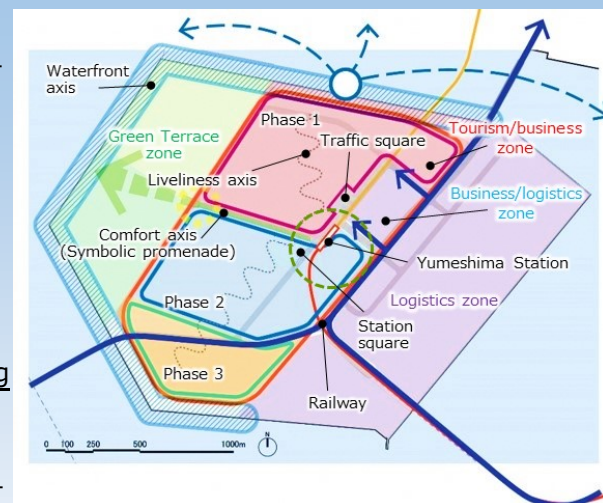
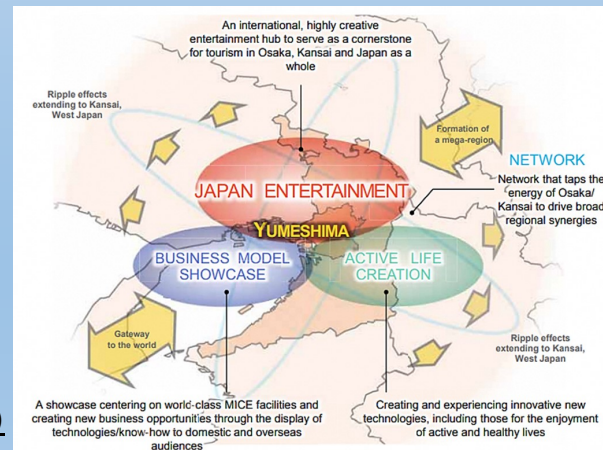
[Phase 3] Urban development for long-term stays, leveraging the efforts of Phase 1 and 2.

■ EXPO 2025 will be held in OSAKA, KANSAI, JAPAN

• The Expo is scheduled to be held from April 13 to October 13, 2025 (184 days) under the main theme of “Designing Future Society for Our Lives” and is expected to attract about 28 million visitors.

• Hosting the Expo will lead to further development of Osaka and the regional economy, and after the Expo, we will continue to promote urban development projects based on the principles of the Expo.

Midosuji District

Midosuji Boulevard is Osaka's main street that spans 44 m in width and approximately 4 km in length between Umeda and Namba, the city's two major areas. In particular, the area between Yodoyabashi and Hommachi is located in the Semba area, which has flourished since the 17th century as the commercial capital of Osaka, attracting people and goods from all over Japan, and producing many leading companies in the securities, financial, pharmaceutical, and textile industries.

Recently, it has become a multifunctional area that is busy during the week and on holidays, as the trend towards urban living has led to an increase in the number of residential buildings and other facilities necessary for daily life in the vicinity.

The Multi-functional Business District

We are creating a world-class business district by easing height and other restrictions to enhance business functions, and by improving disaster prevention and environmental performance.



Distinctive Nigiwai, “liveliness” that captivates the world

We have encouraged retail and cultural facilities to locate in the lower levels of the buildings, so as to create a vibrant, world-class brand street in this area. The public and private sectors work together to maintain and manage the area, ensuring its ever-increasing value.

Midosuji, which is located on a network connecting the major areas of Osaka City on a north-south axis, forms a stately space that demonstrates urban dignity together with the landscape of the adjacent buildings.

We are working to transform the streets from vehicle-oriented streets to world-class pedestrian-friendly streets, and are turning frontage road into pedestrian space in preparation for Expo 2025.

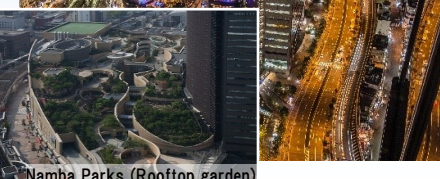
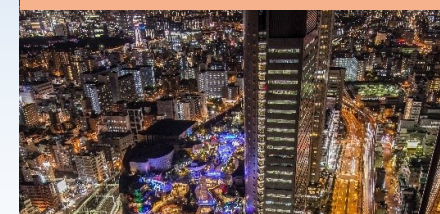


Namba & Minatomachi District

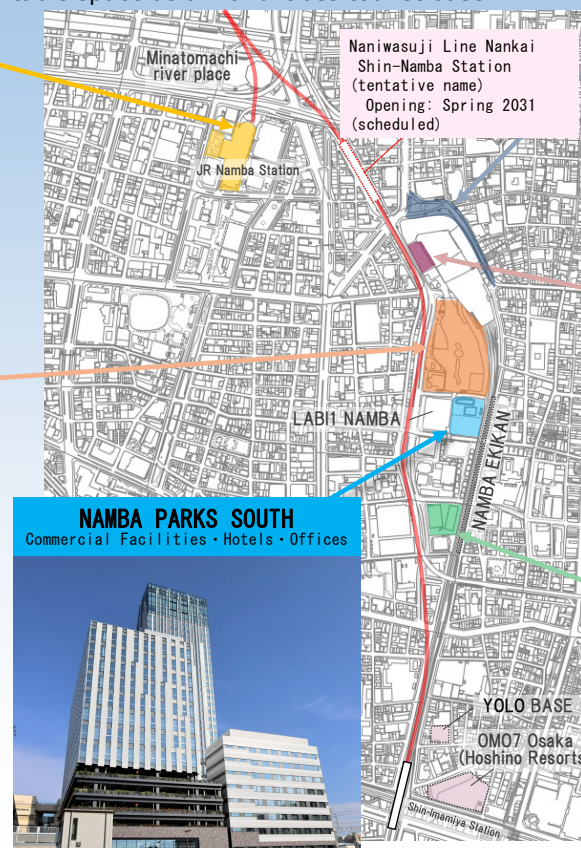
Namba is the second largest terminal in Osaka that directly connects to Kansai International Airport via railway. Located west in Minatomachi, there is the OCAT bus terminal, which is directly linked with nearby railways and expressways. Minami, the downtown area situated in the heart of Namba, is known as a famous entertainment district that retains its profound cultural history of over 350 years and continues to build upon its fame. In recent years, in parallel with the expansion of accommodation facilities, initiatives have been undertaken to strengthen the area's business functions and ability to attract a broad range of visitors. Around Namba Station, we are working on a project to transform the street from a space for cars to a space for pedestrians, thus creating a high-quality, comfortable space as a world-class tourist base.
